Trophies & Awards

The ANAWBS Committee is very grateful for the continuing support received from valued companies and businesses. Their generous sponsorship allows us to provide the trophies for classes and awards.

Medals

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals are awarded based upon the merit of the wine or beer in each class.

Class Trophies

Trophies will be awarded to the top medal winning wine and beer for each class. Certificates are awarded to First, Second and Third in each wine and beer class.

Awards

Special Trophies are awarded for the:

Best Wine of the Show Best Beer of the Show

The Mash Paddle – National All Grain Brewer of the Year

Best Kit Beer of the Show

Winemaker of the year 2019This trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the highest point score for their best five (5) wines in the wine classes. The classes must include at least one Red (W1 to W15), at least one White (W16 to W20) and at least a Rose (W21) or Sparkling (W22) or Cider (W23)

Brewer of the Year 2019This trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the highest point score for their best five (5) beers in the beer competition. The five best beers must include beers from at least three (3) of the competition

categories









BJCP

The ANAWBS beer competition is now a BJCP sanctioned competition. The Beer Judge Certification Program or BJCP is a non-profit organization formed in 1985 in America "to promote beer literacy and the appreciation of real beer,

and to recognize beer tasting and evaluation skills." It has been described in the press as a "hands-on ... study program designed to teach aspiring beer enthusiasts about the essence of any kind of beer". The BJCP certifies and ranks beer judges through an examination and monitoring process.
